

1ST EUROPEAN MATHEMATICAL CUP 24th November 2012–1st December 2012



Report

Association Young Gifted Mathematicians Marin Getaldić organised The First European Mathematical Cup during late November and early December 2012. In collaboration with the local organizers the competition was attended by almost 100 students from seven countries in Europe.

The competition was divided into two categories: Junior Category (for students younger than 17 on the day of competition), and Senior Category (all students not currently attending a University Course). All competitors are given one test with 4 problems, one in each of algebra, combinatorics, geometry and number theory, to solve during the time of 4 hours.

This mathematical competition is one of the rare competitions that are held late in the year at a time when there are only few other international competitions. Also, all students are taking the exam in their own city and have their exams after the competition sent for the coordination in Zagreb. Writing the competition in their home town was possible only due to lots of effort by the local organizers (math teachers and students who themselves were once competitors).

After coordination, the best students have been awarded medals and prizes.

Junior Category

Of the four task that the students were given, combinatoric one proved to be the toughest where the average score was 0.1 points, while the contestants showed up on the first problem, where they scored an average of 4.1 points.

Prizes will be awarded in the IMO-like way: so the cut-offs are determined by the ratio of 1:2:3 (the least of first prizes, and the most of third prizes), and that no more than half of the contestants receive a prize. Also, the best three students in each category will be awarded medals.

Senior Category

Statistically, Seniors have scored less points on average than Juniors. Seniors have an average of 3 points on the first problem, while the last and the hardest problem has an average of 0.06 points.

For the senior category the prizes and medals are awarded in the same fashion as for the Junior category.
